Here is what that book has to say about Margaret's parents.

"Margaret Weer VanTilburgh, born 19 November 1851, was the 4th child of Philip C. Weer, 1821-1877, and Catherine Winner Weer, 1824-1890. Philip C. and Catherine, married in Warren County, 20 November 1844, lived in Franklin and are both buried at Franklin Cemetery. Margaret's grandparents were John Weer, born in County Antrim, Ireland, 31 October 1778, and Mary G. Phillips Weer, born in Warren County, 1 February 1781."

It's a pretty neat book. I've marked it up and got post it notes all over it marking stuff that applies to me. It has pictures of some stuff regarding the Weers, like Philip's tombstone and a picture of Margaret with her brother and his wife.
