My son Sam Minter implied I might have more genealogy information earlier than John Hurlbut but I do not.

The single typed page I have titled Hurlburt Family has as point 1:

John Hurlbut moved to EWoodstock, VT from Salem, Mass in the 1700s. He had been a sailor. His family dated in Salem to the 1600s. John married Philipie Emerson and they had 12 children, the first born in 1760. The second child was John Hurlbut, Jr.

2. John Hurlbut, Jr. married Olive Harvey. They had a son Hiram Harvey hurlburt, who apparently added the second "r" to the name making it HURLBURT.

Then it continues with that line without further mention of the other 11 children. Hiram Harvey Jr. was father to my grandfather

However, in another document that goes back through one of the wives - there is this unrelated note, possibly of interest:

In Who'sWho, a book published annually since 1849 at paternoster Row, London, England, I find the following: Ethell Hurlblatt, Principal of Bedford College for Women, also principal of Aberdare Hall, Cardiff, Wales. Engaged for several years during long vacation on staff of Bedleian Library in British Museum. Also Honorable Secretary of South Wales. Promotion of education for women until 1898. This book was for 1899. Address: Bedford College, York Place, Baker St.W
